	<p>Queen Elizabeth Park Surface: asphalt Rating: 3 & Type 4 Painted: 1 yes, 16 no # of courts: 17 Status: Serious cracks and heaves on various courts, to the point of creating dangerous footing (see courts 12 and 13). Despite being very well used, these courts have been neglected in terms of maintenance/ repair. Courts 10-16 are a public embarrassment and should be a top priority for repair. Park Board has recently put up some new nets, and patched and painted court 9 as a "pilot project". Pilot project? Courts 1, 2, 5, 6 would be ideal location for lights, as no direct neighbours, and players use these courts nearly year round.</p>
	<p>Langara Surface: asphalt Rating: 1 & Type 3 Painted: yes # of courts: 4 Status: Courts are relatively newly resurfaced. No cracks and well taken care of by the regular users.</p>
	<p>Robson Surface: asphalt Rating: 4 & Type 4 Painted: yes, but very faded # of courts: 3 Status: Extensive cracking, some root invasion, and debris.</p>
	<p>Guelph Surface: asphalt Rating: 3 & Type 4 Painted: no # of courts: 2 Status: Small cracks, no root invasion. Sand comes onto courts from the playground.</p>
