	<p><b>McBride Park</b>          Surface: asphalt          Painted: no          Status: Courts were recently resurfaced. At 14 feet the fencing is too close to the back of the courts and creates safety issues. No cracks. Courts would be very good if painted.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">Rating: 1 &amp; Type 4          # of courts: 4</p>
	<p><b>Memorial West</b>          Surface: quick dry          Painted: no          Status: No cracks, generally good shape. Due to type of surface, it is dangerous to play on. Fencing needs painting or coverage because of rust.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">Rating: 5 &amp; Type 5          # of courts: 6</p>
	<p><b>Lost Lagoon</b>          Surface: asphalt          Painted: yes          Status: Nice courts. Balls can be lost in the bush on the west side - you can be punished for hitting them over the fence.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">Rating: 1 &amp; Type 3          # of courts: 4</p>
	<p><b>Stanley Park-Central courts</b>          Surface: asphalt          Painted: yes          Status: Upper eleven courts were recently surfaced, painted, and are in good condition. Centre strap nets. Location is ideal for events and programming. The lower 6 pay courts will soon need paint. These courts deserve a bubble for winter play. Court areas beneath the heron nests get heavily pooped on from May to the end of July.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">Rating: 1-2 &amp; Type 3          # of courts: 17</p>
	<p><b>Tatlow Park</b>          Surface: asphalt          Painted: no          Status: Cracks on all courts, strong root invasion.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">Rating: 3 &amp; Type 4          # of courts: 3</p>
	<p><b>West Point Grey</b>          Surface: asphalt          Painted: faded paint          Status: Cracks, root invasion in corners, and poor drainage.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">Rating: 4 &amp; Type 4          # of courts: 4</p> <p>Great spot, view of city.</p>
